Memorandum of Understanding between Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan University Health Board and C3SC and GVS: You are invited to comment on the draft Memorandum of Understanding between Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan University Health Board and C3SC and GVS. Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan University Health Board (UHB) has been working with C3SC and GVS to develop a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). This is the result of discussions with key stakeholders about the role and contribution of the UHB Framework for Working with the Third Sector, and has been developed within the context of the range of strategic partnership arrangements now in place.

The first UHB Strategic Framework for Working with the Third Sector was developed in 2012 and this has been reviewed on a regular basis and updates provided via Keeping in Touch with the Third Sector events. The [draft MoU](#), which has been recently developed, forms the basis of a shared understanding and a relationship between the Third Sector in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan and the UHB, and will be reviewed annually. Action on Hearing Loss: Action on Hearing Loss Cymru, in partnership with NDCS Cymru, has recently received funding from the Welsh Government to produce

national guidance for local authorities to help them meet the requirements of the Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014 for people who are deaf or have hearing loss. Once completed, it is anticipated that this guidance will become an official Welsh Government document. To support the development of this guidance, they've recently [launched a survey](#) to gather evidence on key issues facing people who are deaf or have hearing loss who need social care and support.
