

## Cardiff Health and Social Care Network – 15 June 2016

### **Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014**

A document was provided on the eligibility criteria that are to be applied under the Act. There are eight levels; only 7 and 8 are eligible for local authority intervention. A discussion took place about the possible opportunities and threats from these.

The following were the main points made:

- Preventative services - provides an opportunity for the third sector but funding for these services remains a possible issue.
- Innovation requires funding.
- Concern raised about people's willingness to accept change and to not feel that they are receiving poorer services.
- Lack of clarity from the statutory sector on how this will impact on the third sector.
- If people are signposted to a third sector service or organisation and it is not appropriate, then what is the mechanism for referring them back to the Local Authorities?
- Suggestion was made that there should be a regular newsletter around implementation for the third sector which provides incremental updates. This should include information that is currently available but also the timeline for when pieces of work, such as the monitoring, will be completed and shared with the third sector.
- What is the process for people to challenge decisions that are made on their eligibility?

Hannah Pursey from the Regional Implementation Team was present at the meeting and confirmed that she would take these points forward. Hannah confirmed that work has begun on training for the third sector on the Act and more information will be made available about this as soon as it is available.

**Actions:**

Preventative report produced by Practice Solutions to be shared with the network through the C3SC website and shared as a link.

Hannah to take the feedback to the different groups working on Regional Implementation and to keep the network updated on the training once it is prepared.

**Policies and tendering**

A paper had been prepared around preparing for tenders by making sure that a number of policies are already in place within your organisation. This was not discussed but has been made available on C3SC website.

**Introduction to the Adverse Childhood Experiences Report**

A summary of the report by C3SC was provided along with a two-page visual of the findings of the report produced by Public Health Wales. Both of these documents are available on the C3SC website.

Adverse Childhood Experiences are potentially traumatic events that happen during childhood and can have negative, lasting effects on health and wellbeing. These experiences range from physical, emotional, or sexual abuse to parental divorce or the incarceration of a parent or guardian. 43% of adults in Wales are estimated to have suffered at least one Adverse Childhood Experience during their childhood.

**Cardiff and Vale APB Substance Misuse and Wellbeing Commissioning Strategy**

The strategy is out to consultation until the 17 June 2016, with a response due to be submitted on behalf of the Cardiff Health and Social Care Network.

A couple of copies of the full consultation document were made available. A short document on the three main areas that our consultation response will be focussed on was provided to each attendee and is available on the C3SC website. The three areas fall under the headings:

- Involving service users, carers and significant concerned others
- Outcomes-based commissioning
- Commissioning Actions

A number of comments were made on each of these, which will feed directly into the consultation response.

**Action:**

Consultation response to be prepared and submitted from the Cardiff Health and Social Care Network. A copy to be shared with the network.

**Cardiff and Vale University Health Board BIG Priorities**

The Health and Social Care Facilitator provided a brief introduction to the three (Bold Improvement Goals) BIG priorities for the UHB for the next 12 to 18 months. All three link to the delivery of Shaping Our Future Wellbeing and were launched by Adam Cairns last week.

BIG1 – In Hospital – reorganise the way medical beds are used at UHW

BIG2 – In Community – The perfect locality, focusing on home first.

BIG3 – Outcomes that Matter to People – Improve healthcare value for the population, achieving the outcomes and experience that matter to them, removing clinical variation from the system.
